### KNIGHTS NET 19 WINS

No one was quite sure what to expect when first-year coach **Laura Mandell** was thrown into the head coaching position for the **Clarkson University Volleyball** team just a few weeks before the start of the season. The result, however, was one of the best seasons' in school history. The **Golden Knights** finished with a 19-12 record, the fourth-highest win total and second-highest winning percentage in 28 seasons. With the entire team returning for next fall, big things are expected of the Clarkson volleyball program.

Junior tri-captain **Heather Sill** (Mendon, NY) led the team in several categories and received many honors during the season, including selection to the **Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association (UCAA) All-Conference** team. Sill surpassed 1000 kills in her career during the **UCAA Tournament** held at Clarkson's **Alumni Gymnasium** and recorded 347 kills during the season, just one short of the total she reached in her freshman campaign. Sill's hitting percentage of .277 was among the leaders in the state.

Several other players stood out for the Golden Knights in 2002, including freshman **Stephanie Thornton** (Corning, NY), who was named the **UCAA Rookie of the Year**. Thornton recorded 252 kills and 68 service

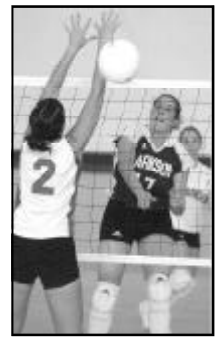

aces, the second-highest single-season total in Clarkson history. Sophomore tri-captain **Christina Lavoie** (Troy, NY) had 835 sets for the Golden Knights, easily a school record. Junior tri-captain **Kim Hoffman** (Massapequa, NY) was steady throughout the season, ranking among the Clarkson leaders in kills, assists, aces, digs and blocks.

Sophomores **Shannon Kentner** (Waddington, NY) and **Kim Spierre** (Averill Park, NY) each enjoyed outstanding seasons at the net for the Knights. Kentner, who was also selected to the UCAA All-Conference team along with Sill, led New York State by a wide margin in blocks per game (2.10) and was among the leaders in the nation in the category as well. Kentner also added 184 kills. Spierre was also among the leaders in blocks per game (1.76) and added 194 kills. The two also combined for 53 aces on the season.

**Ryann Fisher** (Fort Edward, NY) and **Sue-Ellen Trumbull** (Plattsburgh, NY) quietly played excellent defense on the back row for Clarkson. Sophomore **Heather Weldon** (Harriman, NY) and freshmen **Kate Millard** (Hammondsport, NY), **Leiden Woykowski** (Gansevoort, NY), and **Ashley Van Buren** (Richmondville, NY) all contributed to the Knights' fine season and expect to see more playing time in 2003.

## SOCCER TEAMS ENDURE FRUSTRATING SEASONS

It is doubtful that in his 13-year tenure with the *Clarkson University Men's Soccer* team that head coach *Willi Steinrotter* has suffered through worse luck. The *Golden Knights* struggled to finish with a 2-12 overall record, but very easily could have reversed their record with just the slightest amount of good fortune. Clarkson owned just a 2-7 record in games decided by a single goal, including losses to top regional teams St. Lawrence (1-0), Plattsburgh State (2-1), and Cortland State (2-1). Along with their close losses, the Knights were also unable to pull out two victories in which they scored three goals. All in all, the line between tremendous success and utter disappointment was quite slim for the 2002 Golden Knights.

Senior co-captain *Jonathan Banz* (Dix Hills, NY) led the Golden Knights with seven goals and 17 points. Banz finished his career with 17 goals and 50 points, ranking him 12th on the all-time list at Clarkson and was selected a UCAA First-Team All-Star.

Though the *Clarkson University Women's Soccer* team, guided by 2<sup>nd</sup>-year coach *Laurel Stewart Kane* ended the season with a 4-13-1 overall record and a three-game losing streak, the *Golden Knights* final six games saw them turn a corner, which may lead them to the UCAA playoffs next season. Starting in a 3-0 loss against Rensselaer, the Knights began to assert themselves offensively and defensively. This newly discovered assertiveness helped the Knights win their first UCAA contest since 1998 when they defeated Vassar 2-1 in overtime at *Hantz Field*. Clarkson followed up that victory with a 7-1 win over Cazenovia. The Knights closed the season with losses at Ithaca, Union and Skidmore, but their final three opponents understand that Clarkson is not far away from participating in post-season tournaments.

The Knights enjoyed a balanced offensive attack that included all four classes. Sophomore *Linda Fernandez* (Kennebunkport, NY) led the Green and Gold with six goals and 15 points, placing her among the leading scorers in Clarkson's history after just two seasons.

The annual *Clarkson Alumni Men's Soccer* game saw the old-timers hold off a late charge by the *Golden Knights'* varsity prospects to gain a 3-2 victory in an exhibition game at *Clarkson Field* on Saturday afternoon. A trio of former all-stars led the Alumni squad, featuring 20 former Golden Knights. *Mike Kirmse* '94, who has played professionally for the Rochester Rhinos in A-League soccer and is a 1993 All-America, *Stan Brener* '98, a top offensive force for the *Green and Gold* in the mid-1990s, and Clarkson's all-time leading scorer and 1991 All-America, *Larry Martin* '92, gave the Alumni a 3-0 lead early into the second half. The Knights battled back on goals by freshman *Chris Mott* (Clifton Park, NY) and senior *Jonathan Banz* (Dix Hills, NY) to make it a one-goal contest.

## SEELEY NAMED WOMEN'S HOCKEY COACH

**R**ick Seeley has been named as the head coach to usher in *Women's Hockey* as a varsity athletic program at *Clarkson University*. Seeley, who has served as the head coach at Manhattanville College the previous three years, will lead the *Golden Knights* into Division I competition beginning with the start of the 2003-04 season. The Green and Gold will compete as an independent and will play a mixture of teams from the Division I and III levels during their inaugural campaign next season. In 2004-05 Clarkson will join the ECAC. This year, Seeley will concentrate on recruiting and laying the foundation for Clarkson's newest varsity athletic team

"I think Rick brings a level of professionalism and maturity on how to start up a program," said *Clarkson Athletic Director Sean T. Frazier*. "Rick brings a precise understanding of the game. More importantly he understands issues of higher education and the rigors faced by the student-athletes. Coming from a highly selective atmosphere at Manhattanville, the same way it is highly selective here at Clarkson with specializations in science and engineering, I think Rick will fit in nicely. He is going to be able to get it done, especially at the highest level."

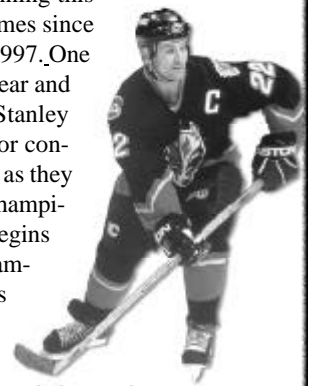
During his three seasons at Manhattanville (1999-02), Seeley guided the Valiants to a 54-16-4 overall record. Last season he led Manhattanville to a 23-2-2 record and into the NCAA Division III Championship game, where the Valiants lost to Elmira 2-1.



The *Clarkson University Women's Soccer* team spent a fall afternoon in Canton washing rescue vehicles at the Canton Firehouse. The *Golden Knights*, along with head coach *Lauriel Stewart-Kane* and assistant coach *Paul Stinson*, washed four ambulances and two firetrucks in a goodwill gesture. The Canton Volunteer Fire Department donated seven firehoses and a gate valve to the Clarkson women's soccer team to help in the watering of practice fields. *Clarkson hockey* has perennially been known as a powerhouse in NCAA Division I competition. Now many of the players from recent years that helped established the *Golden Knights'* program among the elite in college hockey are starting at the professional level. Six former Clarkson University Hockey players have skated in the opening games of the *National Hockey League* this season. *Todd Marchant*, who starred two seasons (1991-93) for the Golden Knights, is in his 10th year with the Edmonton Oilers. Competing against Marchant and the Oilers in the Northwest Division are two former Clarkson captains, *Craig Conroy* and *Chris Clark*, skating with the Calgary Flames. A 1994 All-America and a Hobey Baker Award finalist at Clarkson, Conroy is entering his ninth season in the NHL and has been named captain of the Flames this year. Clark '98 has also played a key role for Calgary skating in 115 games for the Flames entering this season. A two-time All-America (1996, 1997) and Clarkson's fourth all-time leading scorer (90-108-198) *Todd White* has made a major impact with his hometown Ottawa Senators. Beginning this season, White has played in 143 games since entering the NHL with Chicago in 1997. One of the top rookies in the NHL last year and a dangerous scoring threat in the Stanley Cup playoffs, *Erik Cole* was a major contributor for the Carolina Hurricanes as they won the 2002 Eastern Conference Championship. A 1999 All-America, Cole begins his second NHL season. Cole's teammate at Clarkson for two seasons (1997-99) and fellow 1999 All-America and co-ECAC Rookie of the Year, *Willie Mitchell* has helped anchor the Minnesota Wild's young defensive corps.

Mitchell, who broke into the NHL with the NJ Devils in 1999, has skated in 103 NHL games entering the 2002-03 campaign. Several former Golden Knights serve in the front office of NHL teams. Clarkson's all-time leading scorer (98-153-251) and 1977 All-America, *Dave Taylor* begins his sixth season as the LA Kings' Senior Vice President and General Manager. Taylor spent 17 seasons (1977-1994) skating for the Kings, played in four All-Star Games and finished his professional playing career with 1,069 points on 431 goals and 638 assists through 1,111 games. Former Clarkson player, coach and athletic director, *Bill O'Flaherty* '71 acts as Los Angeles Director of Player Personnel, while *Mike Smith* '67 is Director of Hockey Operations for Chicago. *Jarmo Kekalainen* '89 is Director of Amateur Scouting for the St. Louis Blues after playing 55 NHL games with Boston and the Senators from 1989-94.



## CLARKSON STUDENT-ATHLETES MAKE UCAA ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

The *Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association (UCAA)* announced its *2002 All-Academic* team for the fall season, which included 32 *Clarkson University* student-athletes in five different sports. To be selected to the All-Academic team, student-athletes needed to be of sophomore standing and possess a 3.2 grade point average.

The *Clarkson Women's Soccer* team was the most-represented team among the Clarkson fall offerings. Seniors *Lindsey Perkins* (Lisbon, NY), *Laura Tilley* (Coram, NY), *Andrea Barberi* (Rochester, NY), *Sarah Kenney* (North Conway, NH) and *Shaina Bellis* (Spencerport, NY) led the *Golden Knights* both on the field and in the classroom. Junior *Kelly Martin* (Wantage, NJ) and sophomores *Sarah Francis* (Seneca Falls, NY) and *Trisha King* (Xenia, OH) also made the team.

The *Clarkson Men's Soccer* team had three players gain All-Academic accolades, including senior *Jonathan Banz* (Dix Hills, NY), junior *Ken Rushing* (Paw Paw, MI) and sophomore *Brandon Daniels* (Fairport, NY).

The *Clarkson Volleyball* team saw six players reach the necessary standards for All-Academic honors, including juniors *Kim Hoffman* (Massapequa, NY), *Heather Sill* (Mendon, NY), and *Sue-Ellen Trumbull* (Plattsburgh, NY) as well as sophomores *Ryann Fisher* (Fort Edward, NY), *Christina Lavoie* (Troy, NY) and *Heather Weldon* (Harriman, NY).

The women's tennis team had four players make the All-Academic team, led by senior *Maura Tutty* (Ilion, NY) and juniors *Nicole Mikkelsen* (Jackson, NJ), *Katherine Cyr* (Gorham, ME), and *Adrienne Schepler* (Rochester, NY).

The *Clarkson Cross Country* team enjoyed tremendous success on the courses and in the classroom as well with five men and three women making the All-Academic team. Senior *Keith Lachut* (Corning, NY), junior *Nick Kreilach* (West Leyden, NY), and sophomores *Brian Lawney* (Port Jefferson, NY), *Mike Otte* (Aspen, CO) and *Nick Guertin* (St. Albans, VT) each reached the standards for the men while junior *Erin Morgan* (Adams Center, NY) and sophomores *Nadeeka Yapa* (Potsdam, NY) and *Jessica Snyder* (Constable, NY) represented the women's portion of the cross country team.

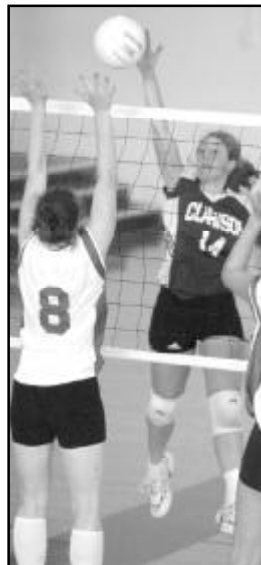

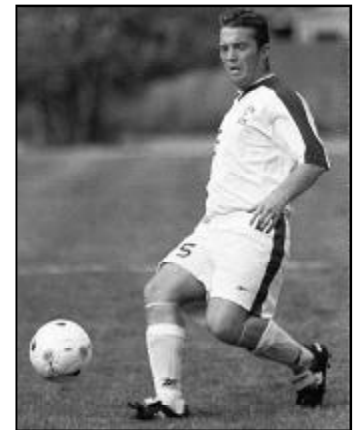

Solid performances from senior **Brian Malanchuk** (Plattsburgh, NY) and junior **Eric Wallace** (Ilion, NY) led to a respectable showing by the **Clarkson University Golf** team this fall. **Malanchuk** closed out his collegiate career by winning the Hobart Invitational on October 5. Malanchuk shot a 76 on the CenterPointe Golf & Country Club course to pace the Golden Knights to a second place finish in their final competition of the 2002 campaign. Wallace paced the Green and Gold to seventh place in the **Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association (UCAA) Championship** and a tied for 12th out of 17 teams in the **Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Upstate New York Qualifier**. Freshman **Sam Morse** (Camden, NY) became the first **Golden Knight** runner to win a race this fall, finishing the 8-kilometer race at the William Smith Heron Invitational in 26 minutes, 35 seconds. Sophomores **Mike Otte** (Aspen, CO) and **Brian Lawney** (Port Jefferson Station, NY), freshman **Eric Tyo** (Peru, NY) and senior **Matt Vogel** (Boxborough, MA) came in second through fifth, respectively for the Green and Gold, as the men easily outdistanced the competi-

tion to claim their third consecutive championship at Geneva on November 2.

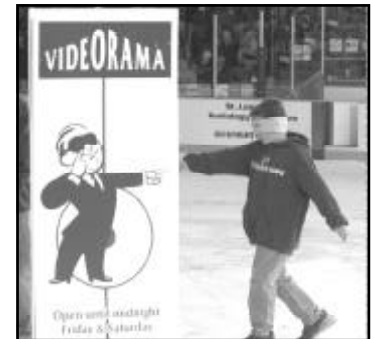
