### 2005-06 SEASON in REVIEW

Whith a couple of favorable bounces of the puck in late February and early March, a very good season for the Clarkson Women's Hockey team could have turned into an amazing run for the emerging Division I team.

In only its third year as an NCAA program, Clarkson, guided by head coach **Rick Seeley** and assistant coaches **Shannon Smith** and **Laura Hays**, made great strides in establishing itself as one of the premier teams in the nation during the 2005-06 campaign.

Ranked among the Top 10 teams in the country throughout the majority of the season, Clarkson skated to a 22-14-1 overall record and finished in a three-way tie for third place in the ECACHL with a 12-8 conference mark. The Knights came within a second of clinching a coveted home-ice berth in the playoffs before Harvard rallied back to edged the Green and Gold 3-2 in overtime at **Cheel Arena** in the final game of the regular season on February 25.

Clarkson faced off again against the Crimson the following week in Cambridge, Mass. during the first round of the league



playoffs and took the eventual ECACHL Tournament Champions to the limit. After falling 1-0 in game 1 of the best-of-three game series, Clarkson downed Harvard 2-1 in overtime in game 2 before the Crimson once again edged the Knights, 2-1 in double overtime of the deciding third game on March 5.

Juniors, captain **Lindsay Williams** and assistant captains **Christine Bailkowski**, **Emma Madigan** and **Ashley Shaidle** led a young Clarkson squad, without any seniors on the roster, which gained the respect from every team it faced for its disciplined, hard-working style of play.

The first ever all-star for Clarkson, **Kira Hurley** backboned the Knights in goal during their breakout season and earned numerous accolades in the process, including second-team All-America and the ECACHL Goaltender of the Year. Hurley anchored one of the stingiest defenses in the country and posted an NCAA-high 10 shutouts. She boasted a .937 save percentage and a 1.29 goals against average en route to a 21-12-1 record.



Although Clarkson came up short in its bid to upset St. Lawrence, the Golden Knights certainly showed they could skate with the number-one ranked team in the nation before a record crowd of 2,136 in Canton. The Knights, who already knocked off three Top 10 ranked teams, looked to be on their way to another win over a nationally-rated foe when they jumped out to a 1-0 lead against the Saints. Another strong effort in goal by Kira Hurley and an opportunistic offense helped to lift Clarkson to the biggest victory in the program's brief history as the Golden Knights shut out number-one ranked St. Lawrence before a Cheel Arena record crowd of close to 2,000. Hurley posted a season-high 34 saves and Jessica Cloutier and Ashley Shaidle tallied first period goals as the Knights handed the Saints their first loss of the season. 





Four minutes, 22 seconds in to a second overtime period, Clarkson saw its season end as the fifthseeded Golden Knights dropped a heartbreaker to fourth-seeded Harvard in the final game of the best-of-three ECACHL quarterfinals series.
